Education: Discussion of Future Introduction to Pickleball Lessons Point Person: Greg Schulte

Greg and Lorrin Lee proposed registering for future "Introduction to Pickleball" lessons on our website. They feel that the class size should be limited to 8 students on one court. The implementation date is May 17th. John says it is easy to create an online form and he will have it up and running quickly. Repeat students were discussed with a suggestion that after 6 beginner lessons students may no longer attend the Intro class because of the demand; exceptions may be made if space permits. "Mentored Play" was suggested by Tina and Mark to help with beginner player transition. This is where an advanced player supervises the play of four beginner players who are apprehensive about being mainstreamed. Different communication methods were discussed to announce this new form of registration: word of mouth, newspaper announcements, website posts, door poster and Club emails. Once the new courts are finished, Greg and Lorrin intend to alternate the once a week class between the gym (inside on Wednesdays) and the new courts (outside on Saturdays.)

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT FOR NEW COURTS

1. Crescent brand equipment box (see photo)

- The box is large enough to fit everything I know of including ball and paddle buckets, squeegee, paddle queues, round robin equipment, and what I know of proposed clinic equipment.
- Weighs approximately 500 pounds so shouldn't need to bolt to concrete
- Will fit with back to exterior fence between court fence and east exit gate with 18" clearance on each side.
- Weatherproof
- Accommodates a Master brand combination lock.
- Current listed cost is \$2,630 with free shipping
- <u>Approval for up to \$3,000 is requested</u> in case there are cost increases, shipping costs or other unexpected expenses.

2. Court Squeegee (see photo)

- Highly rated type of court squeegee
- Can be modified to detach the roller from the handle so it will fit more easily into the storage box.
- Approval for up to \$150 is requested. Current listed cost is \$125
- 3. Paddle holder queue racks (see photo)
 - I propose that we use 2 queue racks for the new courts, one for the 4 north courts and one for the 4 south courts
 - The queues would line paddles up in groups of 4 (on each north and south group of 4 courts) and the firs 4 paddles waiting would go to the first court that completes a game on the respective north or south group of courts. Basically one queue for the north 4 courts and one queue for the south group of 4 courts
 - I believe that just with the establishment of a verbal tradition and even without signing, play would evolve to more recreational play on one side and more competitive play on the other 4 courts.
 - Two 16 paddle racks, if completely full and with all 8 courts full, would accommodate a total of 64 players.
 - The proposed racks can be easily put up and taken down each day and stored in the equipment box.
 - Current cost is \$329 x 2 (\$660)
 - Darren has generously offered to pay for the racks. <u>With board approval of the</u> proposed queue system and type and number of racks, I'll forward the ordering info to Darren.



PPC Round Robin Options Until New Courts are Finished

Proposed by Ann Mayer

Offer Round Robins twice a month; once for Intermediates & once for Advanced players. Saturday mornings would be for all levels. The RRs by level would require players to register for the event on Wild Apricot.

At 8th Street:

1. Reserve all 4 courts for a 2 hr block of time for 16 players; 6 games.

OR

- 2. Reserve 3 out of 4 courts for 2-4 hrs (leaving one for public use.) This would allow for two possibilities:
 - 3 Courts for 12 players; 6 games in 2 hrs.
 OR
 - First Roster: 12 players, 6 games in 2 hrs.
 - Second Roster: 12 players, 6 games in 2 hrs. This would allow 24 players of the same level or different levels to play. For ex, 8:30-10:30 = Intermediates and 10:30-12:30 = Advanced level players.

In the Gym:

- 1. Reserve 3 courts for 2-4 hrs for two Round Robins; same or different levels.
 - First Roster: 12 players, 6 games in 2.0 hrs.
 - Second Roster: 12 players, 6 games in 2.0 hrs. This would allow 24 players of the same level or different levels to play. For ex, 8:30-10:30 = First Roster (Intermediates) and 10:30-12:30 = Second Roster (Advanced).
